## February is Black History Month in Canada!

During Black History Month, Canadians celebrate the many achievements and contributions of Black Canadians who, throughout history, have done so much to make Canada the culturally diverse, compassionate and prosperous nation it is today.

### **Black history in Canada**

People of African descent have been a part of shaping Canada's heritage and identity since the arrival of Mathieu Da Costa, a navigator and interpreter, whose presence in Canada dates back to the early 1600s.

The role of Blacks in Canada has not always been viewed as a key feature in Canada's historic landscape. There is little mention that some of the Loyalists who came here after the American Revolution and settled in the Maritimes were Blacks, or of the many sacrifices made in wartime by Black Canadian soldiers as far back as the War of 1812. Few Canadians are aware of the fact that African people were once enslaved in the territory that is now Canada, or of how those who fought enslavement helped to lay the foundation of Canada's diverse and inclusive society.

Black History Month is a time to learn more about these Canadian stories and the many other important contributions of Black Canadians to the settlement, growth and development of Canada, and about the diversity of Black communities in Canada and their importance to the history of this country.

Many activities will be happening around the school to celebrate these achievements.





### HEALTH CONCERNS

### **DROP OFF AND PICK UP**

In efforts to continue keeping our Cubs safe, please read and adhere to the following instructions:

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Drop-Off	Pick-Up
<ul> <li>A facial covering must be worn outside of the vehicle.</li> <li>No pets are allowed at the drop-off zone (unless it is a registered service animal).</li> <li>Do not drop off your child off prior to 8:35am as there is no supervision (if you arrive early, you must wait with your child).</li> <li>The snow pile is off limits to all students.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>A facial covering must be worn outside of the vehicle.</li> <li>No pets are allowed at the pick-up zone (unless it is a registered service animal).</li> <li>Students being picked-up will wait at the bottom of the school yard path in the junior yard.</li> <li>Parents must be visible at the top of the hill before students are allowed to walk up.</li> <li>On snow days when busses are not running, students will be dismissed from the main office only.</li> </ul>

If your child will be absent, please call or email the school to notify us. You can also leave a message on the machine. To ensure student safety and minimize disruptions at dismissal time, please ensure you call the school **before 2:00 pm** to notify us of student pick up! Thank you for your support!

SNOW DAYS are HERE! If transportation is cancelled in the morning, please call the school to inform us that your child is at home. You can leave a message on our machine if the lines are busy.

According to Safe Arrivals policy, we must phone for each student who is not present if we have not heard from a parent/guardian. \*\*Remember – you must pick up your child at the school by 3:05. If there is no transportation in the

morning, there will not be any in the afternoon as well. Thank you for your support!
